Pervasip Corp., a cloud-based voice and video communications solutions, apps and services provider, has released a global home phone that runs its VoX Communications mobile VoIP app on an Android Wi-Fi only DECT 6.0 handset. VoX offers phone numbers from 57 countries.

Broadcom Corporation today announced that **Teracom**, a provider of terrestrial network operations in Sweden and Denmark, has selected Broadcom silicon to demonstrate 4K Ultra HD and DVB-T2 broadcast capabilities with Boxer TV. Broadcom chipsets support the advanced high-efficiency video coding standard (HEVC) to reduce video bandwidth usage by 50 percent.
